

Sustainability Studies Update

The results from 2E's air quality testing in Dalkey Village, Loreto Avenue and Harbour Road are in. Having monitored the air quality in three locations via test tubes from the 25th September to the 23rd October, the data we recorded contributed to a national survey carried out by Globe Ireland. 2E and Mr Oman determined that there was a reading of 14.25, which represents >10 µg NO2/m3 of Nitrogen Dioxide. This is deemed unsafe by WHO and EU Guidelines if exposed to this level over the period of a year. We were surprised by these findings given the coastal location, however, it serves as a reminder to us all of the importance of walking or cycling rather than driving where possible. Well done to 2E on achieving the below certificate for their work and thank you to Mr Oman.
